






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## **WHO WE ARE**

# MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO

"We optimistically look forward to another year of growth in our upcoming 2021-2022..."

Thank you to each of our donors who continue to support the life changing work Variety, the Children's Charity of Manitoba does on behalf of children of all abilities during our 2020-2021 year.

No one ever imagined that we would still be dealing with COVID-19. The toll it has taken and the affects it has had on all of us both personally and professionally cannot be understated. However, it is with sincere gratitude that the work Variety does has been uninterrupted. We continue to adapt to our environment and remain flexible in our efforts.

One such area is our Gold Heart Gala. Despite not having a Gold Heart Gala for the second straight year, I am pleased to report that our revenues have rebounded to pre-COVID times. This was a result of several key factors.

- Our dedicated staff team strategically sought new sources of revenue,
- Our generous donors stepped up and many increased their support,
- We established new key relationships with generous donors like Kinsmen Clubs of Winnipeg and Dominos Pizza,
- We increased our community fundraising efforts, and
- We increased our granting relationships; accessing government subsidies that we qualified for.

We have adapted our programming throughout the year. Due to the challenges of navigating through the pandemic, our programming was at times reduced, delayed or cancelled. As a result, its associated direct costs fluctuated. Variety ensured that we reallocated available funds from affected programming to our special needs program to make sure we were helping as many children as possible.

Sadly, Variety's Camp Brereton remained closed for a second year. While we were not able to host the 1000+ children camp normally impacts, we did spend the summer making a number of improvements and upgrades such as, cabin renovations and removal of obstructive brush. Plans continue for the new main washroom pavilion. Once completed, the addition of this new modern building will provide a safe, comfortable and accessible washroom facility in close proximity to our camper cabins.

We optimistically look forward to another year of growth in our upcoming 2021-2022 where we will recognize Louis Trepel with our inaugural Lifetime Achievement award at our Gold Heart Gala on May 7, 2022. We are delighted to honour Louis' immeasurable impact over 44 years of dedication to Variety Manitoba and his involvement with so many other local charitable organizations.

We would not be able to do the work we do without an incredible Board of Directors. Thank you to our outgoing Chair – Lisa Cefali for her insight and leadership. At the same time, we welcome our new Chairperson – Peter Mackenzie. Peter was recognized as our Volunteer of the Year last year and is excited to take on this new role.





## **VARIETY STORIES**



#### **NATHAN**

As part of Nathan's autism diagnosis he has sensory processing and self-regulation challenges. Nathan consistently drops heavily into chairs, slumps, walks heavy and bumps into things. Nathan needs strong input to his muscles and joints to get a sense of where his body is in space to feel regulated. His family has been through many chairs and bed frames for Nathan and this has been hard on them financially; replacing furniture multiple times. The Norix Rock Smart Chair is specifically designed to meet the needs of people like Nathan. It is highly durable and easily cleaned. The one piece design and rear bumper prevent over rocking and the chair has been proven to provide a calming, safe, and comfortable seat for people requiring rocking for self-regulation. As you can see by the huge smile on Nathan's face he loved his new chair!

#### **HENRY**

Henry was born with a condition called Arthrogryposis Multiplex Congenita (AMC). Early and consistent intervention and care is really important for Henry's development. Physiotherapy, occupational therapy and a series of surgeries will help Henry be as independent as possible. Unfortunately, because these surgeries could really help Henry, he was deemed not eligible for publicly funded supports including respite care. Henry's family really needed respite support to ensure Henry receives all of his therapies after each surgery and his parents can continue to work. "We were able to find a wonderful respite worker and the family is thrilled with her support and are so thankful! Henry is already showing more progress in his development and openness to exploring new things, and having new experiences with her. Mom and Dad have had a bit more time for self-care and to better manage their schedules, and Henry's needs." - Family's Rehab Counsellor




#### **CHARLENE**

Charlene is 3 years old and living with severe hearing loss. Due to the pandemic Charlene was unable to have in-person therapy sessions. Her family was unable to afford a computer to access her therapy sessions virtually. Variety's Special Needs Program provided Charlene with the technology she needed to once again connect with her therapists. "Im so happy to share this photo of Charlene during her online/virtual lesson with her teacher for the deaf and hard hearing program. This photo was taken in January, after we received the iPad and keyboard from Variety. It has been such a great help for my daughters learning, interaction and communication skills for the past several months. Charlene is developing her listening and speech skills! Our family is very thankful for your organization and for helping kids who need assistance with their development." - Charlene's Family

#### MUSIC THERAPY IN SCHOOLS

By adapting to COVID-19 regulations, Variety's Music Therapy program was able to operate during the 2020-2021 school year. Most sites ran in-person music therapy sessions. The sites ensured students came from the same cohorts, masks were worn and each student had their own instrument kit that was sanitized before and after use. Some sites also operated using Microsoft teams so programming could occur virtually.

This year 18 school sites participated, 4 were unable due to restrictions within their school division.

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# VARIETY'S CHILDREN'S DENTAL OUTREACH PROGRAM


Variety's Children's Dental Outreach Program continued for its 17th year providing preventative education, dental screenings and free treatment to children in need. A total of **1,381 children** were screened for potential oral health problems. **729 treatments** were provided to treat oral health problems for **210 children**.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 had a larger impact on the program run in partnership with the University of Manitoba and the Winnipeg School Division. Due to restrictions within schools and remote learning periods throughout the year the number of children screened through the program was down **50**%. In 2019, Variety began forming partnerships with private dentists to help more children who did not attend the schools serviced by Variety's Dental Outreach Program. The number of children supported through this new avenue increased despite challenges caused by COVID-19. Children like Zaint and Aliah were able to receive life-changing treatment!

"Thank you for all your help with my son's dental work. He is feeling very well now after his treatment! Because of the pandemic, we lost our health insurance coverage when my husband was laid off. My son has been complaining about his teeth for a while so we decided to search online to find some help. Covering the cost of dental care as a low income family was not an option. We came across your program and reached out and quickly got a reply. My son was scheduled to be checked by the dentist right away and got the treatment last week. Now he is doing great and not complaining about toothaches every time he eats. Thank you for all the help that, we really appreciate it. He is always smiling now." - Zaint's Family

She had a toothache nearly every single day and she could not sleep at night. Now thanks to Variety, she's better. She can eat well again, and the toothache does not bother her anymore. # VARIETY'S WINTER WONDERLAND

Variety knows first-hand how the holiday season can be an incredibly stressful time of year for families experiencing economic disadvantage, which is why we created Variety's Winter Wonderland – an annual event that provides a meaningful holiday outing for disadvantaged children. Due to the pandemic we were unable to hold the event in its typical form – so we created the Winter Wonderland Holiday Hampers Program.

On December 8, 2020 distribution of 150 family food hampers and 600 kids' gifts to Plessis Resource Centre, Woodydell Family Resource Centre, Gilbert Park Resource Centre, and Wolseley Family Resource Centre took place. Each family hamper included items for a full festive meal along with a variety of pantry staples and every child's gift included three toys, holiday treats, and winter essentials such as toques and mitts.













#### EVENTS FOR OUR VARIETY FAMILIES

We greatly missed the ability to send our families to events. COVID-19 impacted all events large and small in our city since the pandemic began. In August 2021, we once again started receiving opportunities for our Variety kids and their families which included free tickets to Assiniboine Zoo and the Winnipeg Goldeyes.

# VARIETY'S POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION AWARDS

Our organization began this program to help remove the additional barriers youth living with a disability face in accessing post-secondary education.





### 2021 RECIPIENT: ALEX

"I am so honored to have received the 2021 Post-Secondary Education Award. Throughout my time at the University of Winnipeg, I have often been forced to make difficult decisions based on what is better for my health. I have rather aggressive Rheumatoid Arthritis which has led to multiple flair-ups and resulted in having to take an entire year off from courses. Receiving this scholarship has relieved the financial stress of tuition, allowing me to attend my classes without the weight and concern of expenses related to education weighing on me. The award has also given me a boost in confidence that I am capable of overcoming challenging circumstances related to my health. I am currently in my 5th year of university working towards my BSc in Neuroscience at the University of Winnipeg. Once completing my undergrad, my goal is to be accepted into medical school where I can continue on my journey to use the challenges I have experienced as a way to relate and comfort patients potentially going through similar struggles."





### 2021 RECIPIENT: SULLIVAN

"Thanks so much for the scholarship! It will help pay for my classes and help cover the cost of the disability support I need such as a note taker, tutor and someone to help me get all my classes and course work organized."

Sullivan is living with Charge Syndrome, hearing loss and vision loss. When he was born he had problems breathing and was very sick. Sullivan graduated with honors from high school in June 2020 and began attending the University of Winnipeg in September 2020. Last year university was hard for him because everything was online. His main career goal is to go into broadcasting; he loves watching and analyzing sports. Sullivan is also considering being a teacher because he loves sharing his knowledge in history, geography and sports.

#### 2021 RECIPIENT: **JENNA**

"I have always been a huge science fanatic. During my last semester of high school, I had the opportunity to learn about genes, DNA, and chromosomal mutations that can cause different effects. Learning about what happens in the nucleus of the cell, and how one slight change can determine a characteristic about a person was so fascinating. After doing some research on the future of genetics and what careers were available, that unit in biology helped me decide what my passion was. Recently I learned that my parents saw a genetic counsellor when I was young to understand the reason for mine and my sister's hearing loss. They were able to help identify the mutation that occurred in my genes that resulted in my bilateral hearing loss. After learning that it was a genetic counsellor that helped my family know the reason of my hearing loss, I knew that was what I wanted to do for families in the future.

Winning this award will help me tremendously. With my permanent disability it is already set in stone that I will face more financial burdens than the next person. With this award, it will help relieve multiple barriers related to university tuition and any accessibility services I need. Plus without having to work so much, I will have more time to study and focus on homework."

### **VARIETY'S CAMP BRERETON**

Due to COVID-19 Variety's Camp Brereton was once again unable to welcome children to our camp. The ban on overnight camps instituted by the Government of Manitoba has been in effect since the pandemic began.

During this break we have been busy planning and fundraising as our Main Washroom and Shower Building needs to become fully accessible, which includes the installation of wheelchair ramps and accessible washrooms and showers. We are hopeful to begin construction on this project in fall 2022.
