





ALEX - AGE 12

LIVING WITH HEARING LOSS, DEVELOPMENTAL DELAYS & ADHD

Equipment funded: Ipad & Keyboard

"Alex has benefited so much from his own iPad. There is a shortage of iPads in the division so having his own has been great for Alex. Alex uses the iPad in a variety of ways. He will use the iPad for self-regulation, if he is feeling anxious, angry or upset, the iPad is used for calming and getting him back on track. He uses a variety of apps that create calmness in his school day. His iPad connects via Bluetooth to his hearing aids. We have seen an increase in his focus in his ELA and Math classes – he is focused and able to stay on track when the sound from the iPad is directed to his hearing aids. The iPad is seen as something very positive and helps Alex work toward rewards so he can have some free time at the end of each day."



GABRIEL - AGE 6

LIVING WITH DOWN SYNDROME & HEARING LOSS

Equipment funded: Safety Bed

"My son Gabriel is living with Down syndrome and ADHD. He's able to walk but with assistance. He's also on a feeding tube that requires specialized care. I work part time as my husband works Monday to Friday with shifting schedules. Gabriel's sleep patterns are variable. He wakes nightly and sometimes in the earliest hours of the morning. Being wakeful during sleeping hours often leads to napping in the daytime. These sleep patterns have also impacted our ability as parents to sleep and stay asleep. We need a safety bed to reduce Gabriel's risk of injury. He could fall out of a typical twin bed, and he requires our support to move safely."

JASPER - AGE 9

LIVING WITH CEREBRAL PALSY & HEARING LOSS

Equipment funded: Hearing Aids

"Jasper spent 5 weeks of being in hospitals when he was first born before being given the green light to go home. Today, Jasper loves going to school and spending time with his grandparents. He is a very social child who has a smile that lights up the room. Jasper does use a wheelchair but is not bound to it. He likes to play with his toys on the floor, as well as color. There is a lot of additional costs and barriers to overcome with a special needs child. Jasper did suffer some hearing loss at birth and now requires hearing aids. Being able to hear properly will not only help him in school, but also help him develop his speech further. Funding for hearing aids would go a long way in helping Jasper on his journey. As his father I want him to be as successful and independent in life as possible. Finances can be a struggle when you have an additional needs child and this funding will really help."





JANALIE - AGE 4

LIVING WITH AUTISM

Equipment funded: Communication Device

"Janalie is unable to communicate using words and has moments of challenging behaviors. This behavior will intensify because Janalie does not know how to communicate her needs. As her parents we are left guessing and often times unable to meet her demands due to misunderstanding or not knowing. It would be beneficial for our whole family for Janalie to have an iPad she can use as an assisted communication device. We know this will significantly decrease the behavioral challenges we are experiencing on a daily basis."

Bike Camp

GAVE CHILDREN A NEW FOUND SENSE OF FREEDOM

80 children participated in Bike Camp during the first 2 weeks of July. Many children living with a disability are unable to ride a two-wheel bike. With the use of customized adapted equipment, trained professionals, and volunteers, many children that participated achieved their goal of learning to ride a conventional bicycle independently by the end of camp.



Adaptive Swim Program

GAVE CHILDREN THE ABILITY TO LEARN IMPORTANT LIFE SKILLS

With the return of the program after the COVID-19 pandemic, there was strong interest from all schools, which led to some challenges with scheduling, transportation, and staffing. In addition, all of the early years' students were new to our program this year which meant the swim instructor had to assess large numbers of students in each class.

Despite this, the program ran smoothly on Thursdays and Fridays and had a profound impact on 56 students living with a disability.



"D is an early years student, and it is his first time in our program. His swim lesson is one of the highlights of his week. The school shared that D was so excited throughout the week that he was waking his family up at 2am for swimming. His family had to work for a couple weeks to help him contain his excitement, sleep better in order to participate in the program. D is comfortable in the water, and eager to learn new techniques, and works diligently with his EA. When he is done his lesson plan, D and his EA like to play on the small slide at the pool."



"N is an early years student, and it was his first time in the program. N is often anxious, cautious with new experiences, and shy. N was reluctant to enter the water for the first month of the program. With encouragement from the instructor, and support from his EA, N's confidence and comfort increased. Now N wears a life jacket and enters the water without hesitation. N has not been in swimming lessons before, and spent the year working on rocket glides and flutter kicks with support from pool noodles and flutter boards, and his EA."


